

CHAPTER 41

APPEARANCE TICKET AUTHORIZATION ORDINANCE

41.01 SHORT TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Appearance Ticket Authorization Ordinance"

41.02 DEFINITIONS

- (A) Building Inspector shall be synonymous with Building Official and shall mean any person designated as a Building Inspector at the Construction Code Authority, Inc., and qualified by law to perform building, zoning, and building related inspections.
- (B) Electrical Inspector means any person designated as such at the Construction Code Authority, Inc., who is qualified by law to perform electrical inspections.
- (C) Health Officer means Building Inspector, rental inspector, or other person designated by the City Commission to enforce any provision of Chapter 9 (Housing Ordinance).
- (D) Mechanical Inspector means any person designated as such at the Construction Code Authority, Inc., who is qualified by law to perform mechanical inspections.
- (E) Plumbing Inspector means any person designated as such at the Construction Code Authority, Inc., who is qualified by law to perform plumbing inspections.
- (F) Rental Inspector means any person designated as such at the Construction Code Authority, Inc., to perform rental inspections pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 9 (Housing Ordinance).
- (G) Public Right-of-Way Inspector means any person designated by the City Manager to perform inspections of construction activities within the City's public rights-of-way.

- (H) Sexton means any person designated by the Cemetery Board to enforce ordinances and regulations within the Mt. Hope and Oakdale Cemeteries and grounds.

(I) Fire Official means the Fire Chief, the Fire Inspector through delegation by the Fire Chief, and any other person designated by the City Manager to perform fire inspections under Chapter 18 (Fire Prevention Code) or under Chapter 59 (Business Registration Ordinance).

(J) Code Enforcement Officer means any person designated by the City Manager to enforce the Food and Health Ordinance, the Solid Waste Collection and Disposal ordinance, the Zoning Ordinance, the Streets, Sidewalks and Alleys Ordinance, the Outdoor Storage or Abandonment of Motor Vehicles Ordinance, the Anti-Blight Ordinance, and Business Registration Ordinance.

41.03 AUTHORITY TO ISSUE AND SERVE APPEARANCE TICKETS

(A) Building Inspector.

The Building Inspector is authorized to issue and serve District Court appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe a violation of any of the following ordinances exists: Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Ordinance, Zoning Ordinance, Housing Ordinance, Building Code, Swimming Pool Ordinance, Trailer Coach or Mobile Home Ordinance, Business Licenses and Regulations ordinance, Anti-Blight Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations Ordinance, and Food and Health Ordinance.

(B) Electrical Inspector.

The Electrical Inspector is authorized to issue and serve District Court appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe there is any violation of the Electrical Code.

(C) Health Officer.

The Health Officer is authorized to issue and serve District Court appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe there is any violation of the Housing Ordinance.

(D) Mechanical Inspector.

The Mechanical Inspector is authorized to issue and serve District Court appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe there is any violation of

the Mechanical Code.

(E) Plumbing Inspector.

The Plumbing Inspector is authorized to issue and serve District Court appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe there is any violation of the Plumbing and Sewer Ordinance or Water Regulations Ordinance.

(F) Rental Inspector.

The Rental Inspector is authorized to issue and serve District Court appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe there is any violation of the Housing Ordinance.

(G) Public Right-of-Way Inspector.

The Public Right-of-Way Inspector is authorized to issue and serve District Court appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe there is any violation of the Streets, Sidewalks and Alleys Ordinance.

(H) Sexton.

The Sexton is authorized to issue and serve District Court appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe there is any violation of the Cemetery Ordinance.

(I) Fire Official.

The Fire Official is authorized to issue and serve District Court appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe there is any violation of the Fire Code or Business Registration Ordinance.

(J) Code Enforcement Officer.

The Code Enforcement Officer is authorized to issues and serve District Court Appearance tickets on reasonable cause to believe a violation of any of the following ordinances exists: Food and Health Ordinance, Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Ordinance, Zoning Ordinance, Streets, Sidewalks and Alleys Ordinance, Outdoor Storage or Abandonment of Motor Vehicles Ordinance, Anti-Blight Ordinance, and Business Registration Ordinance.
