Lapeer County Central Dispatch is the sole source for 9-1-1 service in the county. Currently the technology that drives the operation of the emergency telephone systems and the radio systems has become not only out-dated, but is now showing it's age. Both systems are experiencing breakdowns and critical outages affecting the ability of the 9-1-1 Center to effectively handle our citizen's calls for service. This technology is no longer manufactured, nor supported for repair purposes, in some cases.

There is no other viable source to respond to emergencies as no public safety agency has the funds or equipment to do their own call taking and dispatching in Lapeer County. It is critically imperative to keep the 9-1-1 Center up and running to serve the needs of the community.

The most cost-effective and efficient way to do this is to upgrade the systems to modern technology. Joining the digital radio system provided by the State of Michigan and emerging Next Generation 9-1-1 IP-based telephone systems are needed to bring the County's emergency service center into the 21st century.
